

Firearms Licensing – Renewal Applicant

For questions contact the Saugus Police Firearms Officer Lt. Tim O'Brien via email at tobrien@sauguspd.com. Or call 781-941-1127 and leave one message which will be returned within 7 days. **Email is the preferred method of communication** for firearm application issues. Please note that the Firearm Licensing function is done on a part-time basis so please leave just one message or email and you will be contacted.

All applicants must be a resident of Saugus or the owner of a business located in Saugus.

All applicants for a Class A - License to Carry a Firearm (LTC) must be **21** years of age or older.

All applicants for a Firearm Identification Card (FID) must be **15** years of age or older. FID applicants who are **15** years of age, but less than **18** years of age must submit with their application a certificate from a parent or legal guardian granting the applicant permission to apply for a FID Card.

Renewal Applicant Instructions:

Renewal Applicants previously licensed by the Saugus Police Department DO NOT have to schedule an in-person appointment and should submit their completed application and required documents by email to tobrien@sauguspd.com

Renewal applicants **NOT already licensed by the Saugus Police Department** are required to make an appointment to appear in person.

For applicants looking to Sell, Rent or Lease Firearms, Rifles and Machine Guns or to Perform services as a Gunsmith, or Sell Ammunition please contact Lt. Required Documents:

- Completed Massachusetts Resident LTC/FID/Machine Gun Application. The application can be found on the [mass.gov website](http://mass.gov). To download one go to: www.mass.gov/doc/resident-firearms-license-application/download

Renewal applicants must complete an affidavit regarding reporting of lost/stolen firearms. The affidavit form is included with the FID/LTC Application.

- Signed Notice to Firearms Licensing Applicants Form (*page 4-5*).
- Signed Civil Fingerprint Consent Form (*page 6*).
- Copy of your Massachusetts Driver's License.
- Proof of Residency - Two current proofs of residency showing your name and Saugus address (*utility bill, tax bill, mortgage statement, etc.*).

A credit card receipt for your paid application fee (*see fee schedule below*). This is the preferred method for all renewals. After making your credit card payment a receipt will be sent to your supplied email address which you must submit with your completed application.

Non-Refundable Application Fee Schedule:

- License to Carry Firearms (LTC) - **\$100.**
- Firearms Identification Card (FID) - **\$100.**
- License to Carry Firearms (*Retired Law Enforcement*) - **\$25.**
- Renewal Applicants **70** years of age or over – **No Fee.**

If you are unable to submit your application by mail or make a payment with a credit card you can mail or drop off the all required documents with a money order or bank check (*no personal checks*) made out to the Town of Saugus in a sealed envelope, to:

If you are unable to pay online a bank check or money order may be submitted with your application. All bank checks and money orders must be made payable to the **Town of Saugus. Cash cannot be accepted.**

If you drop off an application at the Police Station, please call 781-941-1127 and leave a message advising the Licensing Officer of the date and time you dropped off your application and bank check or money order.

Please note that applications will not be processed until all documents and payments have been received. Submitted documents are retained by the Saugus Police Department and will not be returned to the applicant.

Notice to Firearms Licensing Applicant

You will be asked a series of questions as part of the screening process for filing out a firearms license application. One question will ask if you have ever been arrested or appeared in court as the defendant in a criminal case. This question asks if you have ever been charged with a crime. The final disposition of your criminal case, if applicable, is irrelevant and has no bearing on this question. If you have ever been charged with a crime or seen the inside of a court room as a defendant anywhere in the world at any point in time, then the answer to this question should be yes. Answering yes to this question will not automatically disqualify you from being issued a license. Failure to truthfully answer this question, however, may result in the denial of your application.

Making a false statement on an application for an FID or LTC is a crime under MGL c. 140, s. 131, and may be considered as grounds for denial of your application.

Note: Some traffic offenses are criminal so make sure you know the correct answer before answering the question of whether you have appeared in court. You do not have to put down minor traffic offenses like failure to stop at a stop sign. The key word is “appeared.” You should not confuse this word with being arrested.

The Firearms Law allows us to access sealed records so let us know if you have one.

Applicants with a criminal record are encouraged to review their criminal record before submitting their application as the application fee is non-refundable.

The following is a list of some crimes that if **convicted** would disqualify you for a License to Carry (LTC) or a Firearms Identification Card (FID):

- Felony (Including Juvenile Convictions).
- Misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for more than **2 years** (includes an OUI after May 27, 1994).
- Violent Crime as defined MGL c. 140, s. 121.
- Conviction under the laws relating to Weapons or Ammunition for which imprisonment may be imposed.
- Unlawful Use, Possession, or Sale of a Controlled Substance as defined in MGL c. 94C, s. 1.
- Misdemeanor crime of Domestic Violence.

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- Subject to an open Restraining Order issued pursuant to MGL c. 209A or a similar order or order issued by another jurisdiction.
- Subject of an outstanding Arrest Warrant.

**This is not an exhaustive list of all disqualifiers and like all laws are subject to change.*

Failure to file a change of address form with the licensing authority that issued your license may result in the suspension or revocation of your license. The form can be found by clicking on the following link: <https://www.mass.gov/doc/address-change-form-2/download>

For RENEWAL applicants, if you file your application before the expiration of your current license, you will be allowed to carry firearms under the conditions of your existing license indefinitely, until the arrival of your renewed license. You will need your issued receipt for this grace period to be in effect. If you do not renew before the expiration of your current license, this change to the law does not apply.

Your license will be approved or denied within a **40-day** period, by statute. The issuance of the license after the approval may take an additional period of several weeks. This is because there are several steps that need to be taken by the Licensing Authority and the Commonwealth after the approval or denial of your application.

FBI Procedure for Changing, Correcting or Updating a Record

28 CFR 16.34:

PROCEDURE TO OBTAIN CHANGE, CORRECT OR UPDATE IDENTIFICATION RECORDS.

If, after reviewing his/her identification record, the subject thereof believes that it is incorrect or incomplete in any respect and wishes to have it changed, corrected or updated, they should make an application to the agency which supplied the questioned information. The subject of a record may also direct his/her challenge as to the accuracy or completeness of any entry on his/her record to the FBI, Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division, ATTN: SCU, Mod. D-2, 1000 Custer Hollow Road, Clarksburg, WV 26306. The FBI will then forward the challenge to the agency which submitted the data requesting that the agency verify or correct the challenged entry. Upon the receipt of an official communication directly from the agency which supplied the original information, the FBI CJIS Division will make any changes necessary in accordance with the information supplied by that agency.
